Lag time – Remember, it takes on average at least 4-6 months before we expect to see a response to the vaccine. It may even take as long as 9 months to one year for your pet to benefit from the vaccine!

If an injection is missed by one or several days, simply give the next injection that is due and continue the remaining injections exactly as indicated on the schedule (i.e. if three days elapse after an injection, give the overdue injection followed by the next scheduled injection two days later). Please call our office to reorder vaccine when you give the last injection from your maintenance vial. Each vaccine is specially formulated for each patient and it may take 7-10 days for it to be prepared.
